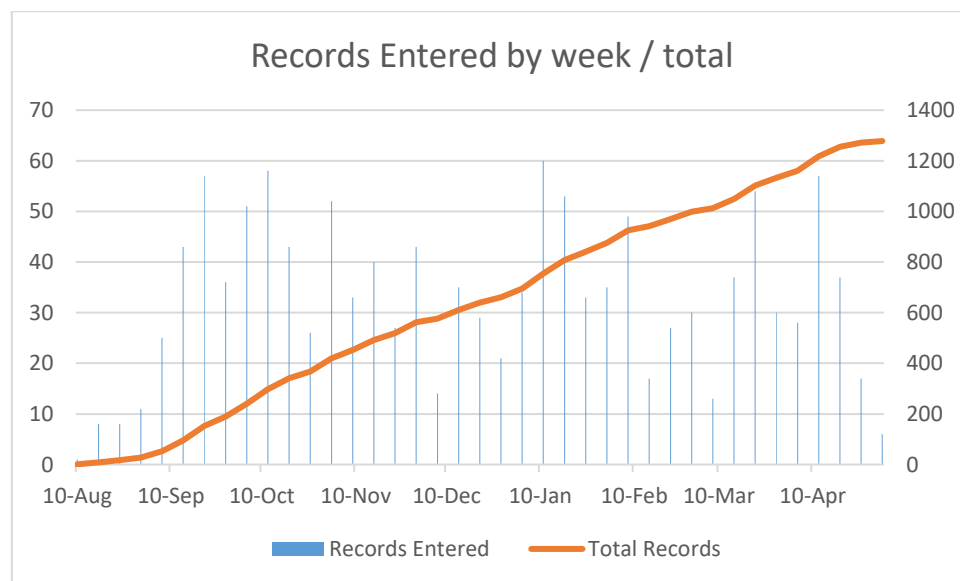
Dear **EAGLE** collaborators,

Thank you for your ongoing support and participation in **EAGLE** safe-anastomosis study. There are currently **53** hospitals active in their data collection or intervention period and an incredible **102** hospitals have now completed the study.

We are grateful to all collaborators who are participating in **EAGLE**, it is by working together that we can optimise and transform patient care around the world, learn from each other and improve our practice.

Data Collection & Intervention Update

More than **1,250** patient records have now been entered into the study. This data has been entered by **134** different hospitals. Sites in their data collection window should ensure that data is collected for each patient undergoing right colectomy with or without primary anastomosis. It is crucial that all consecutive eligible cases are included, if you have any queries regarding whether or not a patient is eligible please email eagle@contacts.bham.ac.uk. Overall we aim to recruit **4,400** patients from **350+** hospitals.



More than **1,600** logins to the **EAGLE** safe-anastomosis modules have been issued to surgeons from sites who have completed or are currently in their intervention period! Of these, **>1,00** have started the modules and **>800** have completed the modules.

During your sites intervention period we encourage as many people as possible to complete the modules. If you are in your intervention period and require additional logins for your hospital please contact eagle@contacts.bham.ac.uk. For those completing the modules, they can be accessed on the website by logging in and selecting '**ESCP Safe-anastomosis Programme**' and work through the 5 modules by clicking '**Commence Module**'. The modules are accredited by the Royal College of Surgeons and those completing the modules are entitled to **3 CPD points**.

New EAGLE Networks

We are delighted to announce the formation of several new **EAGLE** networks across the globe. These networks will play a crucial role in facilitating the recruitment of new hospitals to join the study and promoting the study across their regions.

- **EAGLE India Network**

This network has been setup by the GlobalSurg India Hub, led by Dr Dhruv Ghosh, Dr Ritu Mahajan and other hub colleagues. - **EAGLE South America Network**

Recently established to engage sites across South America, this network has been set up by Dr Nicolas Avellaneda. Nicolas is a colorectal surgeon at the Nueva Proctologia and Centro de Educación Médica e Investigaciones Clínicas "Norberto Quirno" (CEMIC), Buenos Aires. Dr. Helio Moreira Junior will be working with the network to support and recruit hospitals from Brazil. >20 hospitals from across South and Latin America have already registered their interest with the network and in the coming weeks the **EAGLE** team and network leads will host a webinar to share study details and progress their registration. - **EAGLE Middle-East and North Africa Network (MENA)**

Setup by Dr Mohamedraed Elshami, the focus of this network is to lead on and support the recruitment and delivery of EAGLE across the Middle East and North Africa. Mohamedraed has already successfully supported multiple hospitals from Syria, Libya and Palestine join the study. Future Randomisations

We will shortly randomise our next group of hospitals to participate in **EAGLE**. In order for sites to be randomised they must complete their Site Registration Form on REDCap and confirm that all necessary approvals are in place. We cannot randomise any site who has not fully completed their Site Registration Form.

If you have not already done so and would like your hospital to be included in the next randomisation please logon to REDCap (<https://bistc.redcap.bham.ac.uk/>) and complete your Site Registration Form by **Friday 7th May**.

EAGLE will randomise further groups as part of a rolling programme as soon as there is sufficient numbers of hospitals who have completed their site registration forms and are ready to be randomised.
